

Mississippi Peacemaker Wild Bunch Category Rules

Shotgun must be 1897 Winchester or clone (military or civilian) in **12 gauge**.

Rifle can be any SASS legal pistol caliber rifle.

Pistol, in general must be a single full sized, steel framed Colt 1911 or clone in **45 caliber**. Adjustable sights, high rise beaver tail, extended or ambidextrous safety, extended magazine release are all OK. **NO** ported barrels, compensators, electronic or light gathering sights, Blued, nickel or Stainless. No target style grips. See Categories below.

Ammunition must meet SASS and MSSA criteria. Lead bullets no heavier than 230 or lighter than 200 grains making a PF of 150 for the 1911. Lead bullets no heavier than 250 or lighter than 170 and making a PF of 150 for rifles over 40 caliber. For Rifles less than 40 caliber the SASS PF of 60 will be used. Shot size no larger than 7 1/2 for Shotgun.

Staging

Pistol will be transported holstered with the magazine well empty, slide forward on an empty chamber. Magazines will be loaded at the loading table with five rounds only. You may carry two extra magazines in addition to the number required for the stage. A dropped magazine is a dead magazine. Magazines previously loaded with five rounds do not need to be unloaded and reloaded but may be checked by the loading table officer. **PRIOR** to the beginning of the stage, the RO will allow the loading of a magazine into the pistol. The slide will be racked, the safety engaged and verified by the RO and re-holstered. If the RO witnesses the trigger finger on the trigger during the racking of the slide it will be considered a MDQ. The shooter must shoot all five rounds before changing magazines. No shoot 4 then 6. You will have the option to stage loaded magazines on a flat surface or on person. It is not permissible to load or reload a single .45acp round directly into the chamber. Loading and reloading the 1911 will always be accomplished by means of a loaded magazine. Movement with the pistol must always be with the slide locked back and the finger out of the trigger guard (MSV) pointed down range. The shooter may install the magazine on the move but can not rack the slide until he is stopped and in shooting position (SDQ). With the slide locked back, with or without the magazine in the magazine well, the shooter can re-holster or re-stage the pistol on a flat surface pointed down range. At the conclusion of the stage the empty magazine must be removed, slide closed and the trigger pulled to show the chamber is empty. Please do not slowly lower the hammer. Failure to do so will result in a (SDQ).

Rifle will be loaded, staged, restaged and unloaded as per SASS rules and conventions

Shotgun will be loaded at the loading table with the number of rounds equal to the number of targets or to magazine capacity with the action closed and hammer down on an empty chamber. Extra rounds will be loaded off of body for extra targets or make-ups. It will be re-staged with the action open.

Categories

Modern-1911 must be as described above, virtually any full sized, steel framed Colt or clone that does not have light gathering or electronic sights, is not ported, does not have a compensator or target grips is acceptable. May be shot one or two handed.

Traditional-1911 must be basic 1911A1, full sized, steel frame, five inch barrel, no extended or ambidextrous safety, no extended or high rise beavertail grip safety, no extended slide release, no checkering on forward portion of slide or trigger guard, basic drift adjustable sights (no dots, no lines, no inserts) small original front sight, spur hammer, standard bushing (no bull barrel), no solid guide rod, short or long trigger is OK, flat or arched mainspring housing is OK. **Must be shot one handed**, off hand can assist in loading, racking slide and malfunctions.

Regardless of category, all magazines must be standard length, hold no more than eight rounds (Though they must never be loaded with more than 5 rounds) with no bumper pads or extensions and magazine wells may be beveled but not extended or flared. Holsters and magazine carriers must be of natural materials (leather or cloth). The holster must be worn vertically on the strong side (no cross draw, no shoulder rigs) and the magazine carriers worn vertically on the weak side.

NOTE: A Match Disqualification on any side match disqualifies you for ALL side matches. A side match disqualification does not carry over to the main match.
